ART137: History of Graphic Design

This course critically investigates and explores graphic design and visual communication history, materials, techniques and styles, major movements and significant artists and designers. Students build a conceptual and visual understanding of vocabulary, applying critical thinking and visual skills in an evaluation of the historical context and the importance of historical reference in graphic design work.
